Invite a friend or just come to the ongoing Flower Arranging Class that Alfretta, Sherry, and Georgia started nearly 7 years ago. Instruction, constructive suggestions, and opportunities to work with different plant materials with different goals for end results are all part of the monthly class. New participants are always welcome.

The group leaders emphasize using what's available in our gardens and also trying new things. Design basics are stressed regularly. And people are usually PROUD of what they have done! We also learn that we're not perfect every try, but we learn each time.

#### AMERICAN CROW

Corvus brachyrhynchos

- Crows are thought to be among the most intelligent of birds and are very social.
- They are black in color and have a distinct call, 'Caw Caw'.
- ❖ A group of crows is called a 'Murder'.
- ❖ The nest is built by both parents. It is a large bulky basket of sticks, twigs, bark strips, weeds and mud. It is lined w/grass, moss and feathers. The female will lay 4-6 eggs, dull green to gray in color.
- Crows will eat almost everything including garbage. It could be said that crows help clean up our planet! They scavenge along roadways and in dumps. They also eat bugs, frogs, snakes, shellfish, carrion, grains and fruit.
- American crows are susceptible to West Nile Virus making them a useful bio-indicator to track the virus's spread.
